Information Booth Mars Signal Lights

Dear Sir:

Regarding your inquiry in the above magazine, the original "Mars Light", Burlington Installations were a "figure eight" light pattern. "Mars" had a design patent on the "figure eight" light pattern.

The original Burlington installations were made under the direction of Henry Urbach, Supt. of Motive Power, at Aurora, Illinois, on #9900 and the Minneapolis Zephers, all "flat front" non-nose locomotives - over roof head light installations.

All Mars Lights, at that time, were designed to use the "figure eight".

However, in the event, the worm-gear housing was taken apart and re-assembled, so that the gearing was not assembled correctly, as designed, a different light pattern would result, not a "figure eight".

- (A) Also, if the gear timing were assembled correctly and the outside rotary driving arms were assembled incorrectly, a "non-figure eight" would result.
- (B) The motor (worm drive) made contact between two gears, one gear two times the diameter of the second gear, one gear each side of the worm.
- (C) If the gear box is assembled correctly, the reflector dipped two time vertically as the reflector crossed one time horizontially, thereby creating a "figure eight".
- (D) In the event that the gears or outside arms that "drove" the reflector were incorrectly assembled, other light patterns would result. Such as; an inverted "P" or "C", as well as a number of indescrible light patterns.

The above conditions could be the explanation of a questionable light pattern observed by your questions in Railroad.

My interest in your question is based on the fact that I am the original designer of the Mars Locomotive Signal Light (1936-1940) and your interest brings back "old memories".

The original signal light was installed on the original "400" C&NW, Engine 2908 (steam), 6 May 1937, Chicago to Milwaukee.

The original Diesel installation was on the Rock Island Rocket #604, Minneapolis to Kansas City. Later, all six "Rockets" were equipt under the direction of John Farrington, approximately 1938-1939. The Burlington followed the Rock Island.
