PRE-CONVENTION TRAIN RIDE ABOARD THE MTM OSCEOLA EXCURSION TRAIN

Arrive early and you can experience a round-trip ride aboard the MTM Osceola Excursion Train. You will board your bus at 11 am at the Convention Hotel for a 1-hour ride to Osceola, Wisconsin, where you will board the excursion train. The 3-hour train round trip will take you from Osceola, Wisconsin crossing the St. Croix River into Minnesota through scenic northern Washington County to Withrow Junction. The train will turn at Withrow Junction and make the return trip to Osceola where you will take your bus back to the hotel arriving back in St. Paul at approximately 5 pm. A box lunch will be provided. Docents will be on board to answer questions. There is a limit of 110 Participants for this extra fare tour so REGISTER EARLY.

JACKSON STREET ROUNDHOUSE AND MINNESOTA TRANSPORTATION MUSEUM TOUR

Visit the GN and NP Archives at the Jackson Street Roundhouse! Your Archives volunteers will lead a tour of the archives and tell you all about how you can access GN and NP historical documents for research and modeling purposes. This is an important historical resource for all to access!

And tour the Minnesota Transportation Museum! Hear about the restoration efforts undertaken at the MTM. See the work being done on James J. Hill's Business Car (located at a restoration site about 5 miles from MTM) and the GN International Coach-Diner 1146. See the CB&Q Doodlebug and many other exhibits. Access all the restoration bays at the Roundhouse as well as the main exhibit hall at the Museum. Docents and guides will be available to answer questions and talk about the Museum's important work in preserving and restoring railroad history. This is a private event for our group. Bus transportation will be provided to MTM and the James J. Hill A-18 Business Car Restoration site; an entry ticket must be purchased on the convention registration form to enter the museum on this date. You may decide to drive your own car, but there will be NO discount on the entry fee for using your own transportation. Entry tickets will be collected at the door.

TOUR THE JAMES J. HILL HOUSE

Tour the house built for railroad titan James J. Hill. This 36,000-square-foot Gilded Age mansion was once the largest private residence in the State of Minnesota. With 13 bathrooms, 22 fireplaces, 16 chandeliers, a reception hall nearly 100 feet long, and a two-story, skylit art gallery, the house was a symbol of success, personal taste and family life. You will have a 60-minute guided tour of the entire house and self-guided access to the first floor of the mansion. Guided tours are limited to 25 people at a time; we will be forming a group of 50 people per hour divided into two touring groups each hour and we will stagger our groups to start at 1 pm and end at 3 pm (so tours at 1pm, 2pm and 3pm). Bus transportation will be provided. We have been advised that parking at the site is extremely limited, so we strongly encourage everyone to plan bus transportation. A ticket will be required to board the bus and to join the tour. A discount will not be given if you choose to use your own car for transportation to the site. **Participation is limited to 150 people so REGISTER EARLY.**
