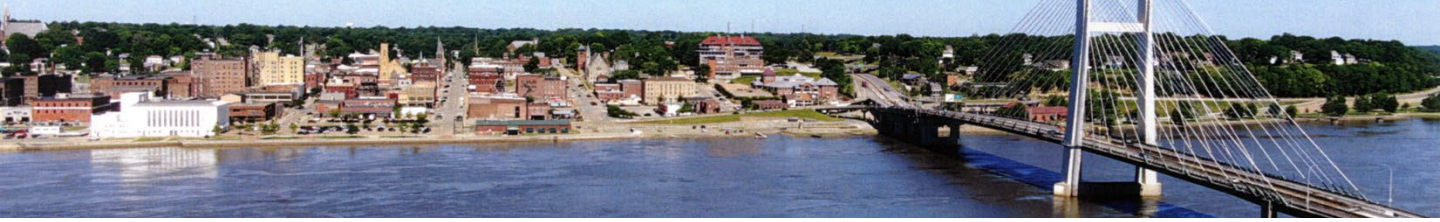

Burlington, Iowa, Railroad History

Burlington, Iowa, is one of the Midwest's most important railroad towns, with its story rooted in the mid-19th-century expansion of railroads across the western frontier.

Founding and Early Operations

The city's railroad history began in 1852 when the **Burlington and Missouri River Railroad (B&MRR)** was incorporated in Burlington itself. The goal was to build a trans-Iowa line connecting the Mississippi River to the Missouri River. The CB&Q reached East Burlington in 1855, and operations on the B&MRR began on **January 1, 1856**, with only a few miles of track. By 1857, the line reached Ottumwa, and by 1868 it extended to Osceola. The final stretch to the Missouri River was completed on January 1, 1870. The B&MR used wood-burning locomotives and wooden passenger cars, serving freight and passengers alike.

Strategic Location and Growth

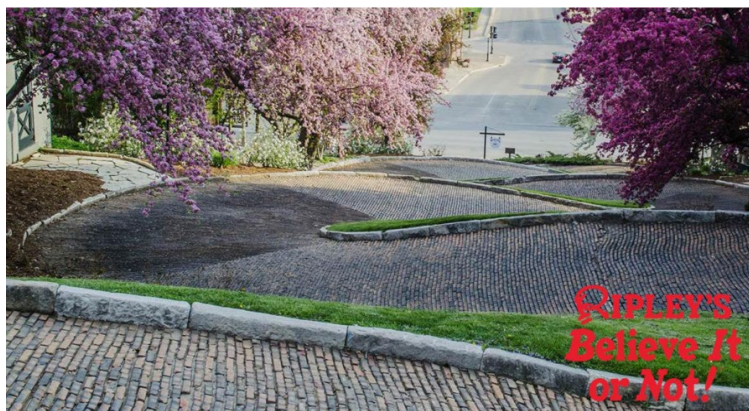
Burlington's position along the Mississippi River made it a natural junction for river and rail traffic. The arrival of the B&MRR transformed the city into a hub for grain, livestock, lumber, and manufactured goods. Passenger trains carried settlers, entrepreneurs, and travelers, while freight trains moved agricultural products to markets.

Integration with the CB&Q

In 1872, the B&MRR was acquired by the **Chicago, Burlington and Quincy Railroad (CB&Q)**, which was headquartered in Burlington for many years lead by Charles E. Perkins. The CB&Q expanded the B&MRR's reach, linking it to the Union Pacific at Kearney, Nebraska, on September 18, 1872, and later that year to Denver. The CB&Q's presence brought skilled workers, technological advances, and economic prosperity to the city. Did you know, Snake Alley is one of the most unbelievable spots in America, on the Mississippi River in Southeast Iowa? Situated in the community of Burlington, is the town's most famous landmark. Here, at Ripley's Believe It or Not! we are officially calling Snake Alley one of the most unbelievable, curious spots in America! But wait, WHY? Well, picture this: Snake Alley consists of five half-curves and two quarter-curves! Believe it or not, that only spans 275 feet (one block), which means the alley was quite complicated to build.
