Lear bir and Brother:

I received your letter today and I will give you all the information I can.

I went on this job August 24, 1927 and the Conductor said it had be customary for the Brakeman to help load milk. He said the Brakeman helped previous to this time I come on the job and I understand that the trainmaster asked the brakeman to help. I was on this job about a year ago and conductor Pressler gave me to understand that I had to hell load milk. I asked by whose instructions and he said Mr. Carters. He said Mr. Carter said if we didn't hell load milk he would put somebody on the job that would help. —o all I can do as work under the Conductors instructions. Conductor Schmitt puts in the time for me loading milk every trip on train No.42.

I put on my overalls coming into Shabbons on train No.42. first stop at Shabbona is to stop at the water tank. I go over cut my steam nose between mail car and baggage car, when thru taking water we pull down and spot for the transfer from the Sterling Eranch. While the Express is being transfured I out behind the mail car and pick up the milk. I leave my overalls on but take core of passengers to Waterman. when thru longing and unloading passengers there at Waterman I go shead to milk car and I remain there until he leave Big Rock. Then I return to the passenger and take off my overalls, then I do not help unload milk until we get to hole. There I go over and put the milk cons to cor on platform so the milk Conductor can put in car. I remain shead in milk cor from bols to the milk stand just west of Maperville. After leaving milk stand West of deperville I return to the passenger coach. At hole and mila stand west of Naperville I work on platform, but from Waterman to Big Rock I help place cans in car.

Hoping this covers the information you wish and I also regret I cannot be at lodge to present this personally but I am getting out tonite and will not be able to attend. If any information lacks I will be glad to give it.
